

## **Presidents Council Resolutions – 14 and 15 May 2011**

### **FUNDING**

#### **KEY FACTS:**

- Sport and Recreation South Africa is responsible for sport
- National Federations and civil society are the implementers to achieve the National Sports Agenda
- Funding requirements need to be quantified utilising research based information

#### **PROCESS:**

Funding requirements assessment to be determined as follows:

SASCOC to appoint a team of to conduct research on the following:

##### **1) Public value of sport**

- How much does sport contribute to the GDP
- To quantify the impact sport has on street children, drug abuse and crime
- To quantify the impact that sport events have on tourism and job creation
- To quantify the value of volunteer contribution to sport

##### **2) Funding needed by Federations to deliver on:**

- Transformation
- School Sport
- Mass Participation
- Recreation
- Capacity building
- High Performance

- Social cohesion
- Coaching
- Technical support etc

#### SASCOC's role

- SASCOC must engage Government at the highest level and the corporate industry:
  - ✓ To motivate the case for sport funding
  - ✓ Tax incentives for sport funding i.e. Direct sponsorships and CSI vehicle for BEE; and tax on import and export
- SASCOC must engage with Minister of Trade and Industry to ascertain the reason for the decline in income revenue from the Lottery.
- SASCOC to engage with the Lottery Board to discuss the challenges that National Federations face in terms of the distribution process.

#### Proposed Resolution:

- SASCOC through its National Federations need to be the primary vehicle through which funding is channelled to deliver the National Sports Agenda
- The funding sources are:
  - National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund
  - All spheres of Government
  - Corporate
  - International agreements and donor funding
- All funding to be approved by SASCOC, no dissident group to get money without SASCOC's approval
